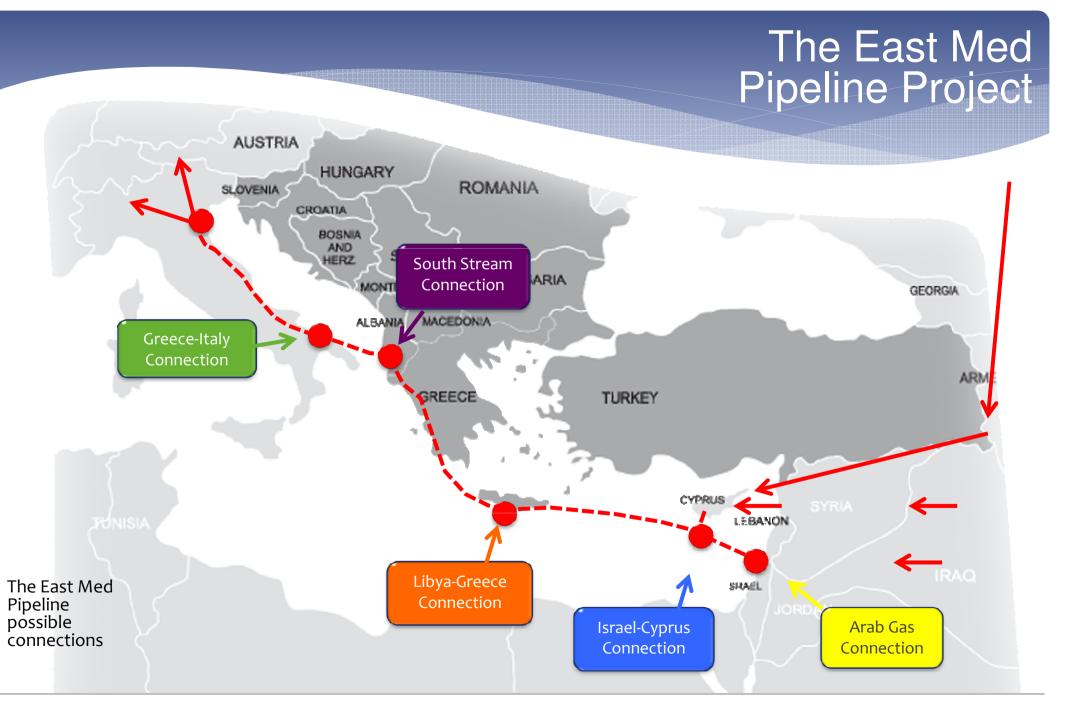






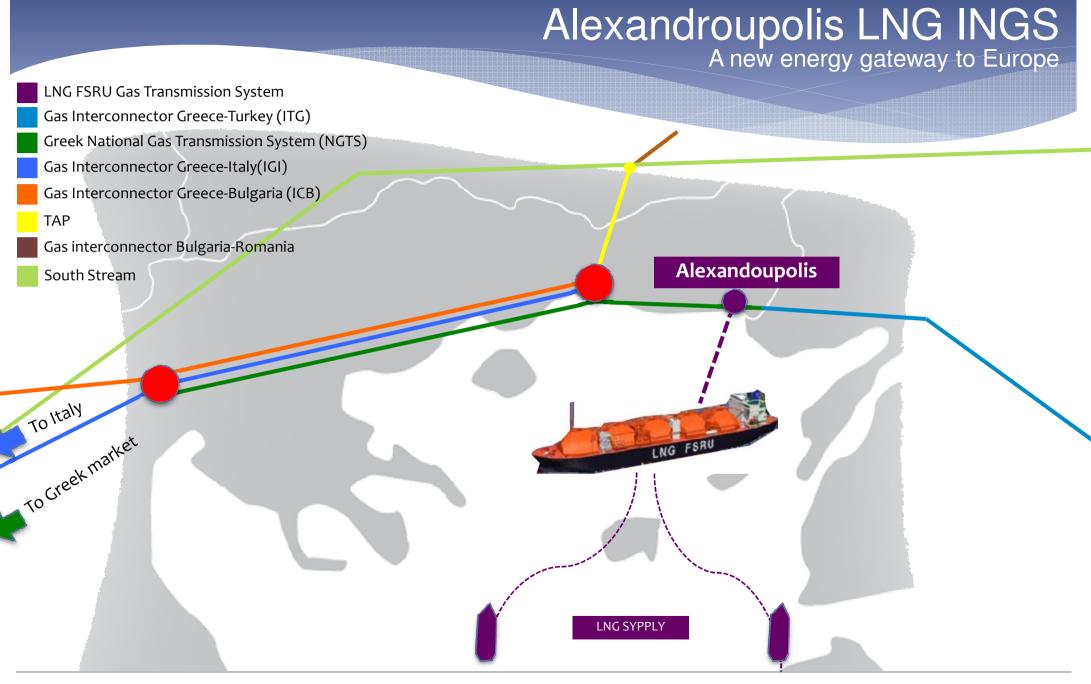








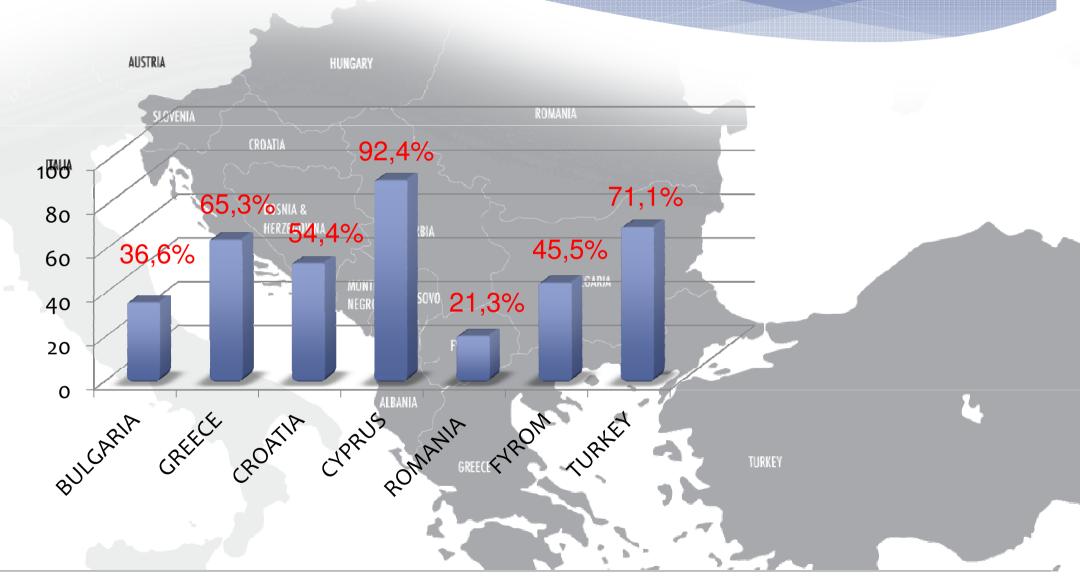








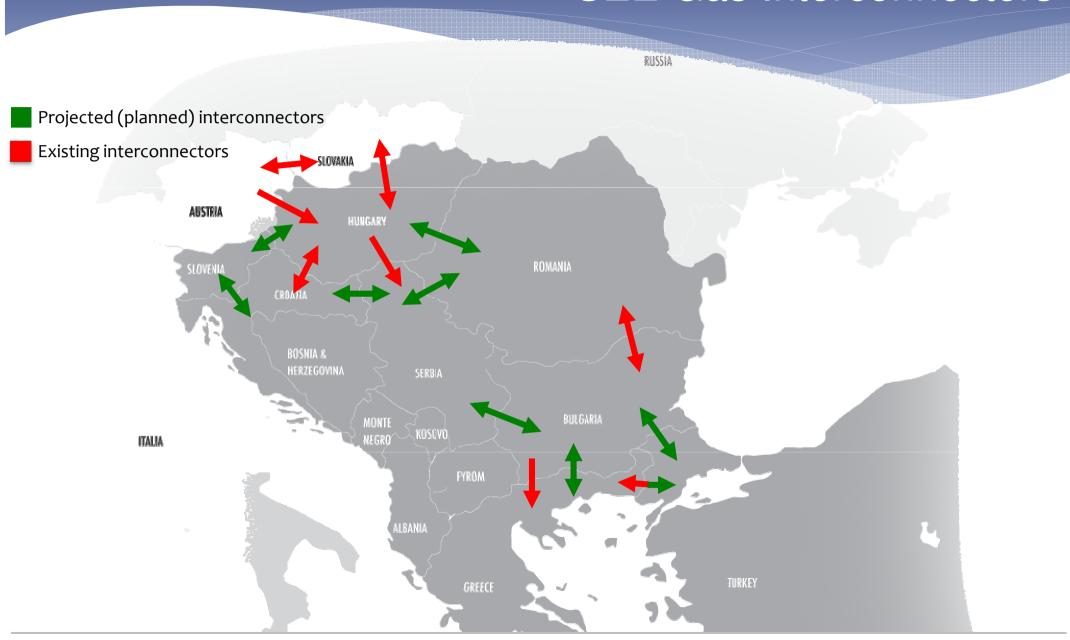
## SEE Energy Dependency 2012(%)





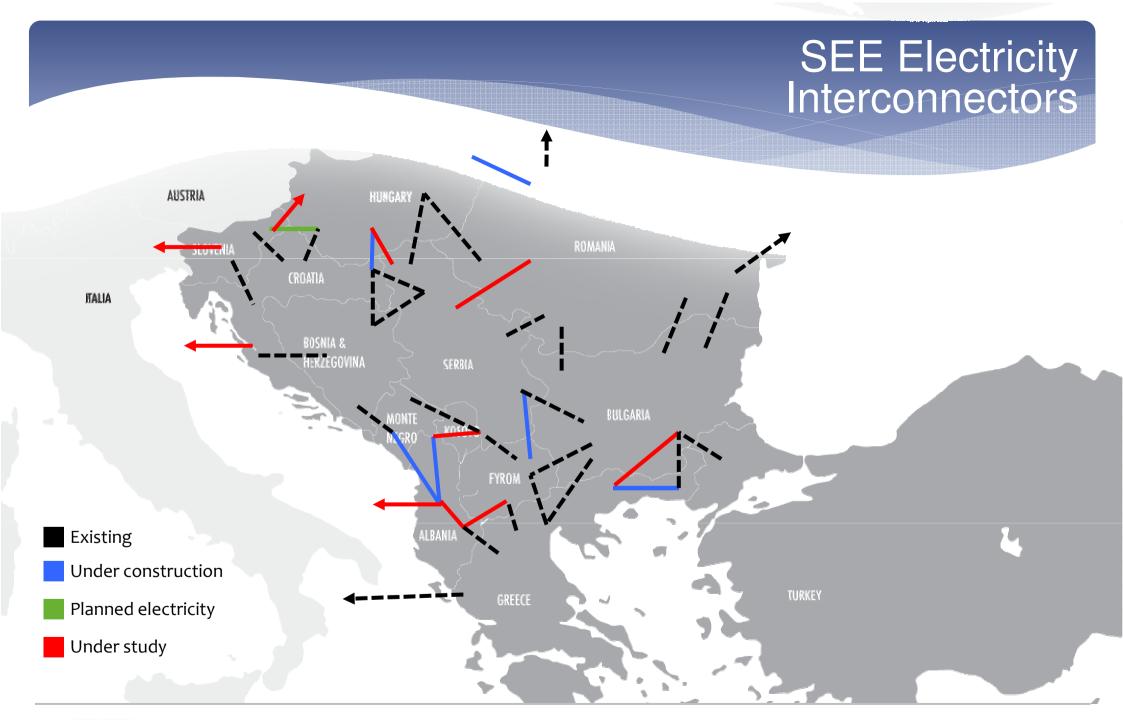


## SEE Gas Interconnectors



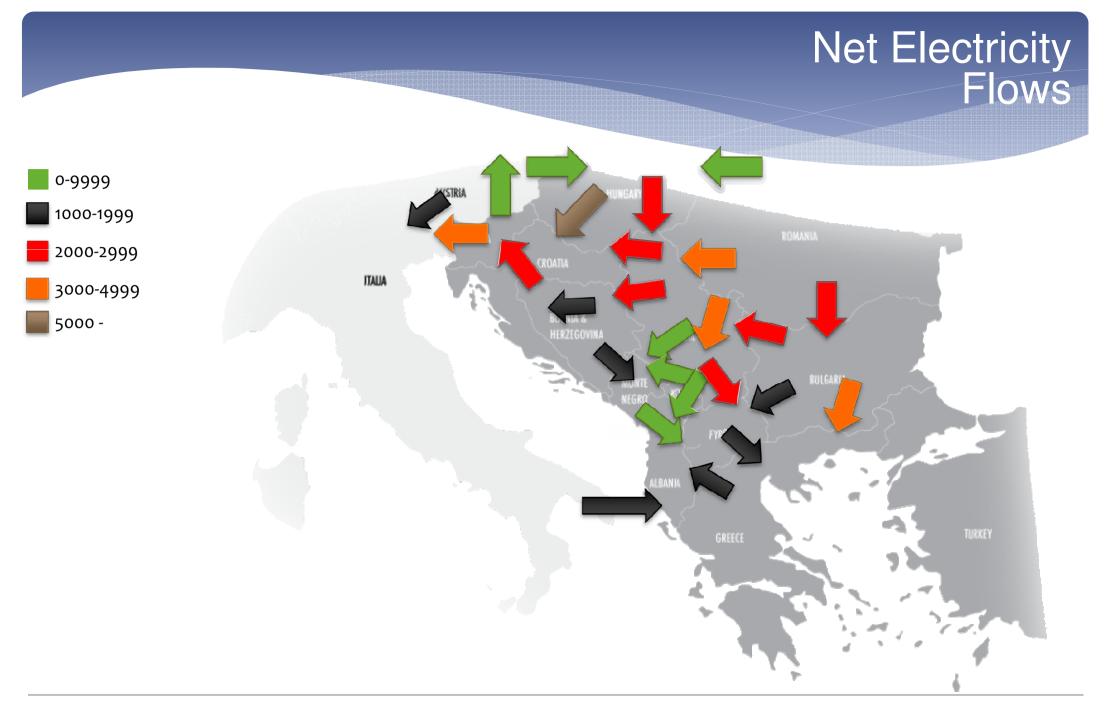
















## EuroAsia Electricity Interconnections
